
An answer for our age

What is it about fellowship over a meal that is uniquely special? Of course good food helps, as does knowing someone cares enough about you to invite you into their home. But there's a special kind of alchemy that happens when we take a collective exhale, pull up a chair, and give – and experience – the gift of presence.

Jesus himself modeled this and so, in turn, did his disciples. Historically, God has gathered his people together – and, especially, gathered people who might not have otherwise shared a meal – and done something powerful in their midst.

Today, in 2024, as we live in a nation divided and perhaps worship at a church that is too, can something powerful still happen when Christians gather over a meal? We think yes.

In fact, we believe this kind of communion of the faithful can be a powerful part of our individual and collective formation. Even when we don't always agree. Even when your day to day might look quite different from mind. And, perhaps especially, even in an election year.

DECIDE HOW MANY PEOPLE YOU CAN COMFORTABLY HOST

Sure, you can sit eight around your dining room table for a formal meal but you can also gather at your kitchen island or in your living room for snacks & sips. 

When folks arrive...

In Luke Chapter 10, we see the competing tension between “get the house ready! Clean up! Make sure everything is just right!” and “be fully present with your guests.”

While we might quibble about the right ratio of the two, Jesus is clear: true hospitality starts with opening your home and offering a focused, calm presence.

You, as the host, want to set a tone that simply says one thing: I’m so glad you’re here and I’m looking forward to our time together. You’ll likely want to spend some time allowing folks to settle in, relax, and eat before transitioning into the time of more intentional conversation. Trust your instincts – and invite the Holy Spirit to nudge you when it’s

time to transition the evening.

And remember: however casual your meal might be, Jesus promises to be present when two or more are gathered in his name so consider this what it is: A feast!
